

So make your next choice a good one. Use your journal. It's for your eyes only. The more time you spend now on your thoughts and ideas the easier it will be for you to make good choices in the future.





Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs)

“You don’t just sleep with one person, you sleep with everybody they slept with too.”

Did you know that every day 10,000 American teenagers choose to get a sexually transmitted infection? ⁽²⁾

If your reaction is, “Nobody would choose that!” think again. Every time you choose to have sex with someone, you are making the decision to accept their sexual past. For 65,000,000 Americans⁽³⁾, that means there is an incurable viral disease lurking in the shadows just waiting to move into its next victim.

Do you think that STDs are one of the reasons why most kids who are sexually active say they wish they weren’t?⁽⁴⁾ Do you think STDs can cause other kinds of problems, like emotional stress, embarrassment and guilt? Please explain by writing a short story using STD’s in the plot.



The fact is there are over 25 common STDs⁽⁶⁾ and people under 25 are their favorite victims. That's because young bodies are still developing and are more susceptible.⁽⁷⁾

Well the answer depends on two things. Whether or not the infection has been diagnosed and what kind of disease it is.

The reality is that 70% of sexually active teens never have been tested for an STD.⁽¹⁰⁾ And for the guys out there who know they have a sexually transmitted infection, in one survey 72% continued to have sex anyway without telling their partners.⁽¹¹⁾ These infections fall into two groups, viral (which can not be cured) and non-viral (which can be cured).

All of the infections beginning with an H are viruses and cannot be cured.⁽¹²⁾ Remember the figure of 70,000,000 Americans with an incurable viral infection. Well there are many millions more with a non-viral infection.

“What’s the STD virus that causes cancer?”

What about Pelvic Inflammatory Disease (PID), Genital Warts and Cervical Cancer?

PID is a serious infection of the reproductive organs that affects females due to untreated chlamydia or gonorrhea. It can permanently damage the reproductive system, causing tubal pregnancies or even infertility.⁽¹³⁾

Genital warts and cervical cancer result from HPV. **Genital warts** are very itchy, contagious and ugly and appear in the genital area. **Cervical cancer** claimed the lives of 4,400⁽¹⁴⁾ women in 2001 and certain types of **HPV** are responsible for many cases of cervical cancer.⁽¹⁵⁾
